Policy Subject Matter: Multiple Casualty Incidents

## I. Policy:

A. Any incident which results in five (5) or more patients should be designated as a multiple casualty incident (MCI).

- 1. The personnel on the first arriving unit shall establish command of the incident for the duration of an MCI or until relieved by an officer of higher rank.
- 2. Upon arrival at scene of an MCI, ambulance personnel shall report to the Incident Commander for specific assignment(s).
- 3. The Incident Commander shall designate specific areas for Immediate, Delayed, and Minor treatment as necessary and shall designate an individual to serve as Triage Officer. Patients shall be assigned to a specific treatment area by the Triage Officer using START system and triage tags.

## II. Purpose:

The purpose of this policy is to ensure that multiple casualty incidents (MCIs) are managed in an organized manner consistent with the Incident Command System.

## **III. Definitions:**

<u>Multiple Casualty Incident (MCI)</u> - A single incident which result in five (5) or more patients.

<u>Incident Command System</u> - A plan to manage multiple casualty incidents consistent with the State OES Region 4 MCI plan and Firescope ICS.

<u>START System</u> – organized system for triaging medical patients in an MCI based on specific patient assessment data.
